



...TO COVID-19

Between March and June, 2020, there were more than 1500 cases of COVID-19 in the North Penn region, and more than 220 deaths from the disease.



The VNA Foundation launched its **North Penn Unity Grants** in late-June, 2020, in an effort to bolster the incredible efforts of the nonprofit organizations serving the diverse North Penn region during the unprecedented pandemic. With rolling application deadlines and a grants budget increased by 50%, these General Operating grants are designed to provide \$300,000 in timely and flexible dollars to help organizations meet the increased need for their services and/or recover lost revenue as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.


Our North Penn Unity Grants are one example of the VNA Foundation's active, evolving commitment to support North Penn during today's challenges and for generations to come.

As the pandemic began to ravage the North Penn region and the quarantine impacted services, the VNA Foundation contributed \$25,000 to the MontcoPA COVID-19 Response Fund as one of the Fund's founding partners and as a member of its Advisory Committee. In an unprecedented collaborative effort, the Fund raised more than \$800,000 to support hundreds of Montgomery County nonprofits in emergency grants.

ADAPTING DURING UNPRECEDENTED TIMES

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic and sharp economic downturn in early 2020, the VNA Foundation **swiftly pivoted our grantmaking** to meet the most pressing community needs. We converted all Spring 2020 grants to **General Operating** support, issued grant decisions and awards almost **3-months ahead of schedule**, and **relaxed reporting requirements** in recognition of the massive impact the pandemic had on our grantee partners.



In Spring, 2020, as the pandemic struck, the VNA Foundation distributed **\$300,000** in grants and removed restrictions from applications seeking project support so all funding could be used for General Operating:


Abington Dental Care Access Program

Through our signature grant initiative, the VNA Foundation continued to support the <u>Abington Dental Care Access</u> <u>Program</u>, a collaborative effort between Abington Jefferson Health and the Montgomery- Bucks Dental Society. With a grant of \$160,000, the program provided hundreds of diverse North Penn residents with affordable dental care in their own neighborhoods.

In an effort to promote information-sharing and collaboration among health and human service providers throughout our region, the VNA Foundation supported the **Bucks-Mont Collaborative** with two grants in FY 2019-20: A General Support grant for **\$35,000** and a special Transition Planning grant of **\$5000** to aid the Collaborative in its leadership transition efforts.
