In everything we do, the VNA Foundation of Greater North Penn values:

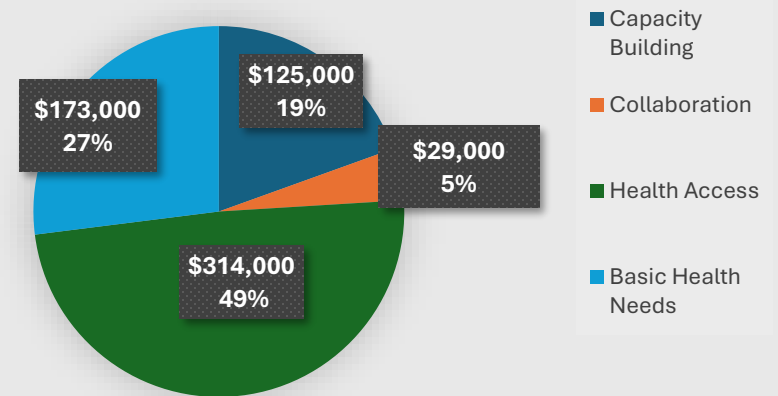
- **ALL PEOPLE:** We act with integrity, respect and human compassion for one another and all residents of the North Penn community.
